We have come so far in our collective effort to advocate for and empower individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Just 65 years ago, people with disabilities were not allowed to attend school with their peers, which is why Favarh was originally formed. Today, the landscape of opportunity for people with IDD has vastly expanded thanks to the tireless efforts of self-advocates, and dedicated families, friends, and supporters like you.



In 2023, Favarh helped over 250 individuals to live independently, to find gainful employment, to volunteer in their communities, to graduate post-secondary education

programs, to participate in life-affirming social activities, and to achieve their personal best. We celebrated the return of the Favarh Players Theater Program, and finally performed Aladdin Jr. after a three-year Covid-19 induced hiatus. We built new partnerships with employers, social groups, and other nonprofits to strengthen our community ties. Our residents at Lavender Fields celebrated their one-year anniversary of living independently in their own apartments. It was a good year.

Despite the many successes of our supported individuals, we know there is still so much more to look forward to. Supportive Housing programs like Lavender Fields and Bear Woods are spreading rapidly across the state of Connecticut and beyond, empowering hundreds of individuals with IDD to finally realize their dream of living independently. We are proud to be at the forefront of this movement and are eager to continue supporting other organizations to build Supportive Housing programs of their own.

Thank you for your continued support of Favarh, and of people with IDD. We can't believe how far people with disabilities have come, and we can't wait to see where they go next.

Our job is to create structures that help people with IDD to overcome the challenges they face, to pursue their goals and dreams, and to thrive.

Some of the supports we provide include housing, employment and day programs, school to adult transition, recreation, transportation, and more. We also help individuals realize their personal goals, from authoring a book to acting in a short film.

Programs - Residential Services

2023 saw continued growth of our Supportive Housing program. Residents at Bear Woods apartments and Lavender Field apartments celebrated their two year and one-year anniversaries of living independently in their own apartments! Two additional Supportive Housing projects based in Farmington were also approved. They are set to open in 2024, and 2026.





Making the transition from high school to 'adult life' can be a daunting change for anyone. Our transition program ensures adolescents with IDD receive the proper education they need to successfully bridge the gap to adulthood.We are now partnered with nine school districts across Connecticut to provide an alternative path to high school students, and most students stick around to become part of our community after they graduate.

This year, seven individuals graduated from Favarh's Project SEARCH, our internship program in collaboration with UConn Health. These individuals all found competitive, individualized employment in the community thanks to the skills they developed as interns. To date, 99% of program participants have found community employment as a result of Favarh's Project SEARCH. Seventeen new Project SEARCH sites have launched across the state since Favarh first introduced the program to Connecticut in 2015.




